**Joseph Estrada's ouster: Was it the right answer?**

Earning the most number of votes ever in the history of presidential elections in the Philippines, Estrada proved that he is really the favorite of the masses. Yet after only more than two years as President, he was ousted and replaced by his Vice President, Gloria Macapagal Arroyo. What started as Ilocos Sur Governor Luis "Chavit" Singson's accusations that he was receiving huge sums of money from *Jueteng* triggered unplanned events and crises. He was the first to undergo the process of impeachment that was not finished and just led to another People Power that toppled him from power last Jan 20. Now that we have gotten rid of him, are we sure that it is the right answer to solve the numerous problems that we are facing now?
